There are some newer products on the market now that do not have the side-effects of drugs we have relied on in the past, namely corticosteroids.

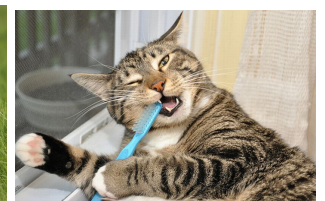
Apoquel tablets daily or Cytopoint injection monthly are excellent products to combat seasonal allergies, and can be used in conjunction with short courses of corticosteroids to get the allergy under control more quickly. Also Hills makes a diet called Derm Defence, which has products to protect the skin barrier from inflammation and secondary infection from yeast and bacteria. Please contact us for more info.

SOCIALIZING YOUR PUPPY DURING COVID19-

Socialisation is not just introducing your puppy to people and other puppies/dogs. This is important, but there are many experiences to which we can introduce our puppies to help them cope well with situations they will encounter during their lives, including introducing them to different sights, objects, surfaces, sounds, experiences, and skills.

Everything new needs to be paired with positive experiences (delicious treats and fun things) so that the puppy forms positive associations with the experience. Socialisation and training should only ever use reward-based methods, whereby the puppy is set up to succeed and is then rewarded for doing the positive behaviour. When socialising your puppy, it is important to make sure they are calm when you start and that you have plenty of treats to use as rewards.

Make sure your puppy has the choice to investigate whatever you are introducing them to or move away if they want to.
